2 Timothy 2:1-2

1 You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. 2 And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others.

THOUGHT

When a legacy is formed, to be passed down from generation to generation there are some qualities that must be involved; strength, trustworthiness, integrity and the ability to teach others. Paul built this legacy. And took what was taught to him and passed it on to Timothy. He challenged Timothy to do the same and to pass it on to others. This is what we call discipleship.
